

### Introduction





# Pseudo code

#### Embed

The embed function is used to embed a secret message into the LSB of an uploaded image. First step is to convert the secret message data from a decimal format to binary format. Then convert the cover image from decimal to binary too.

**Input:** cover image, secret message, secret key //// secret is not required unless the string is encrypted.

Convert secret message into binary

Convert secret key into binary

Break down each byte of secret message and key into bits.

Replace last bit of cover image with a new bit.

Repeat process until no bits are left to insert.

Output: stego image

#### <u>Extract</u>

The extract function is used to extract a secret message from a stego image.

Input: stego image, secret key ////// secret is not required unless the secret message was encrypted.

Break down byte of stego image into bits

Extract the last bit and store it.

Repeat process for the remaining bits.

Convert the gathered bits from binary to decimal.

Output: secret text
